Protective Boxes and Enclosures

During installation, fiber optic cables are often terminated in fiber optic cable boxes or clamshells outside the home. These boxes serve to:

- Protect delicate fiber connectors from environmental damage such as rain, dust, and extreme temperatures.
- Provide a secure point for technicians to splice or connect the fiber to the home network.

- Organize and coil excess fiber to prevent bending or breakage . These boxes are typically mounted on exterior walls, near utility areas, or along poles, and are installed by the internet service provider (ISP) during the setup process.

Connection to Home Network

Inside the home, the fiber cable connects to an Optical Network Terminal (ONT), which converts the light signals into electrical signals for your devices. The ONT is usually installed near where the fiber enters the home and is separate from the outdoor fiber box . In some setups, the ONT and router may be combined into a single device, but the outdoor protective box remains a distinct component.

Summary

In short, fiber optic cables themselves do not include cable boxes. The boxes or enclosures are separate components installed by the ISP to protect the fiber and facilitate connection to the home network. This ensures both the safety of the fiber and reliable high-speed internet delivery .
