Code Requirements

- Plastic boxes: Do not require grounding themselves because they are non-conductive, but any receptacles or switches installed in them still need to be grounded if required by code .

Even in older homes with ungrounded panels or two-prong outlets, it is highly recommended to upgrade to a grounded system for safety . Grounding protects both people and sensitive electronics, and it is essential for modern appliances, GFCI outlets, and outdoor or kitchen circuits .
