The ground wire in the main distribution box provides a safe path for fault current to the earth, protecting people and equipment from electric shock and electrical fires. Purpose of the Ground Wire

The ground wire, also called the equipment grounding conductor, is a safety conductor that does not carry current during normal operation but provides a low-resistance path to the earth in case of a fault, such as a short circuit or insulation failure. This ensures that any exposed metal parts of the distribution box or connected equipment do not become energized, preventing electric shock and allowing circuit breakers to trip safely .

Connection in the Main Panel

In the main distribution box:

- Locate the grounding bar (PE bar), often marked with "PE" or a green/yellow color .

- Connect the ground wire from the power supply directly to this grounding bar. Use a copper core wire with a cross-sectional area meeting local code requirements (commonly 4 AWG or larger for service grounding in the US), .
 - If there are electrical components inside the box, connect them to the PE bar using copper wires to ensure all parts are safely grounded .
 - The grounding bar should be securely connected to a grounding electrode, such as a ground rod or Ufer ground, to provide a reliable path to earth .
- Bonding with Neutral

In the main panel only, the neutral and ground bars are bonded together. This is required by the National Electrical Code (NEC) to ensure that fault currents have a clear path back to the source, allowing protective devices to operate correctly . In subpanels, neutral and ground must remain separate to prevent unwanted current on grounding conductors.

Wire Sizing and Materials

- Use copper wire with proper insulation, typically yellow-green for easy identification .
- The wire size depends on the service rating and local code; for example, 10 AWG in smaller circuits or 4 AWG for main service grounding .
- Ensure all connections are tight and secure to maintain low resistance and reliable grounding .

Inspection and Maintenance

- Verify that the ground resistance is within acceptable limits (often
