

Grounding Requirements for New Distribution Boxes



Overview

Each DISTRIBUTION BOX and controller must be grounded. 26 mm² (10 AWG) ground wire must be used, and in all other markets a 6 mm² must be used.

Grounding of the units: Attach a ground wire from one of the following locations:

1. Provide conduit grounding bushings, bonded together and connected to the equipment enclosure on all incoming and outgoing conductors pertaining to Article 250.1 in the NEC is provided as a reference for the location of the different equipment, structures, etc. in electrical stations including transmission and distribution substations greater than 8 ft from the fence. The fence shall be grounded separately from the grid unless otherwise noted on the appropriate project drawing. See application.
