

How to connect a cold connector for fiber optic heat shrink tubing



Overview

To connect a cold fiber optic connector with heat or cold shrink tubing, strip and cleave the fiber, insert it into the fast connector, then slide the shrink tubing over the connection to seal and protect it.

Step-by-Step Procedure

1. Prepare the Fiber

- Strip the protective coating from the fiber using a fiber stripping tool, exposing the bare fiber without damaging it .
 - Cleave the fiber cleanly with a calibrated fiber cleaver to ensure a smooth end for the splice .
- #### 2. Install the Cold Connector
- Remove the dust cap from the fiber connector and insert the fiber into the fast (cold) connector, which uses a mechanical splice to align and join the fibers .
 - Ensure the fiber is properly seated and aligned using the connector's alignment mechanism.
 - Test the connection with an optical power meter or visual fault locator to confirm proper light transmission .
- #### 3. Apply Cold or Heat Shrink Tubing

- Slide the cold shrink sleeve or heat shrink tubing over the connector and cable before final assembly .
 - For cold shrink tubing, simply slide it over the connector and release it; it will contract and form a uniform seal without heat .
 - For heat shrink tubing, position it over the connector and use a heat gun to shrink it evenly until it tightly covers the splice and connector body .
 - Ensure the tubing captures any strength members (e.g., Kevlar) between the connector body and the sleeve for mechanical stability .
- #### 4. Final Assembly and Sealing
- Slide the tubing fully over the panel adapter or connector interface to create a dustproof and waterproof seal. Cold shrink tubing typically achieves initial sealing in one hour and full sealing in 24 hours .
 - For heat shrink, allow the tubing to cool after shrinking to maintain a secure fit .
- #### 5. Inspection and Testing
- After installation, inspect the fiber visually and test with an optical power meter to ensure low insertion loss and proper alignment .
 - Confirm that the tubing is fully seated and that the connection is mechanically stable.
- #### Tips
- Always clean the fiber and connector surfaces with isopropyl alcohol before assembly .
 - Wear safety glasses when handling fibers to prevent injury .
 - Avoid using open flames on heat shrink tubing; use a controlled heat gun for uniform shrinking .
 - If removal is needed, cold shrink sleeves can be cut with a peeling knife, while heat shrink tubing may require careful cutting to avoid damaging the fiber . By following these steps, you can achieve a secure, weatherproof, and mechanically stable fiber optic connection using cold connectors and shrink tubing.
