A pigtail in electrical wiring is a short wire used to connect multiple wires to a single point or device. It ensures a secure connection by combining wires with a wire connector, like a twist-on connector or a wire nut, and then linking them to the intended terminal or fixture. A pigtail is composed of three strands of wire. The method used to connect this neutral conductor—the pigtail versus the plug-on neutral—represents an evolution in panel design, impacting installation practices and panel organization.
