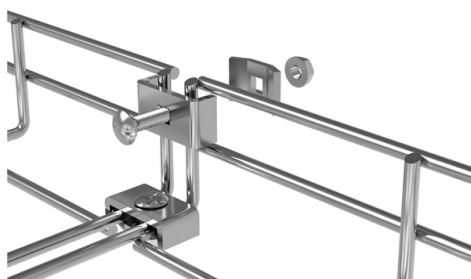

A pigtail fiber is a short optical fiber with a pre-terminated connector on one end and a bare or unterminated fiber on the other. The bare end is typically fusion-spliced to a fiber in a cable or distribution frame, creating a reliable connection point. Pigtails are commonly used in fiber optic terminal boxes, ODFs, and splicing points to interface longer trunk cables with network equipment. They are designed for low-loss, serviceable connections and are not directly connected to devices without splicing first .

Jumper Fiber (Patch Cord)



A jumper fiber, also called a patch cord, is a fiber optic cable with connectors on both ends. It is used to directly connect devices, such as optical transceivers, switches, routers, or ODF ports. Jumpers are flexible, often have a thicker protective jacket, and are designed for frequent handling and reconfiguration in data centers or telecom environments. They facilitate quick connections and cross-connections without splicing .
